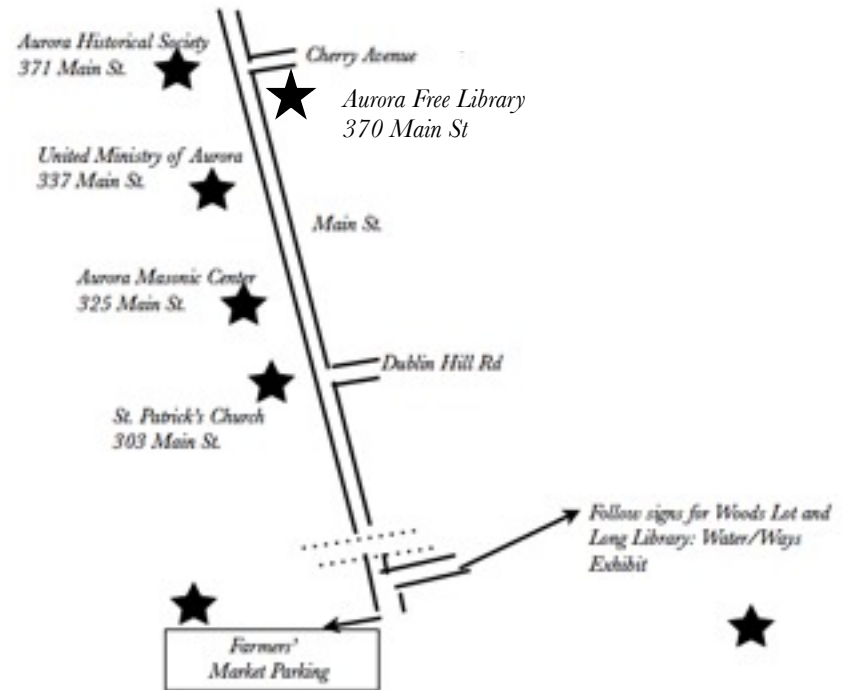




Main Street Strolls **Saturdays, August 17th-** **September 28th** *plus selected special events*

Aurora Historical Society, 371 Main St. Exhibit: “How Cayuga Lake Shaped Aurora: Legends and Lore” *Special Events August 17 and September 14*

Aurora Free Library, 370 Main St., Explore the 1899 building and its upstairs theater, the Morgan Opera House. Open 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

United Ministry of Aurora, 337 Main St., Guided tours of 1860 building and landscaped grounds; history of two congregations. *Organ music most weeks.*

Aurora Masonic Center/Scipio Lodge, 325 Main St. Tours of outstanding 1819 building, including room-within-a-room with original symbolic decorations and historic exhibits.

St. Patrick’s Roman Catholic Church, 303 Main St. Self-guided tours of 1874 building. *Adjacent to Public Access kayak racks on Cayuga Lake.*

Aurora Farmers’ Market, Wells College Boathouse. Fresh produce and unique handmade goods; *free lessons on the wheel offered by potter Robert Warren every week.* Open 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Water/Ways Exhibit, Long Library, Wells College campus. Visiting “Museum on Main Street” Smithsonian exhibit, housed in outstanding Modern building. *Note: exhibit closed Aug. 17; open 2-4 p.m. on Aug 24; thereafter opening for the day at 11:00 a.m.*
