All Welcome to Advent Events at the United Ministry of Aurora, Including the Annual Aurora Christmas Pageant

December will bring a full month of Advent events to the United Ministry of Aurora, which the entire community is welcome to attend and take part in.

- The Nativity Chapel, just north of the church building, will be open from December 1-January 6. It contains 3/4 life-sized figures of the Holy Family, animals, shepherds, kings, and a lovely view of Cayuga Lake.
- Christmas in Aurora! Scott Gross, Organist of the United Ministry, will perform Christmas music on the sanctuary organ from 11 a.m.-1 p.m. on Saturday, December 7 at the church's Bake Sale benefiting The Health Tapestry. The bake sale and other Christmas in Aurora vendors will be set up in the Social Room, the door on the southern end of the building.
- The UMA invites the community to its annual tradition of Lessons and Carols to celebrate in words and music the reason for the season. It will be held on the third Sunday of Advent, December 15, at 10:30 a.m., the regular service time.
- Monday, December 16 at 2 p.m., the Good Shepherd Catholic Community will join us for our annual Cookies and Carols event. Participants will bring cookies so plates of goodies can be made for our shut-in friends and neighbors, to bring them a little Christmas cheer. Following our cookie collections, we will enjoy singing our favorite carols with Scott providing music on the piano.
- Friday, December 20 the Aurora Christmas Pageant, a long time Aurora tradition, will be held in the sanctuary at 7:30 p.m. Kings, shepherds, wild and tame beasts will reenact Jesus's birth with congregational singing interspersed with the narrated story. 
