

As you may know, The United Ministry of Aurora has launched a Building Restoration Capital Campaign to raise funds to restore and repair much needed brick work on the 162-year-old building.

House of the Broken Promise

When her husband is killed in a car accident with his mistress, Anna Lazos-Bishop is left to raise her three-month-old by herself – and quickly discovers that her husband lied about more than just his affair. With a small child, a new job, and an old house collapsing around her, she barely makes it through each day. When town do-gooders hire a contractor to help with repairs and intrusive neighbors push their way into her life, her fragile, solitary existence crumbles. Forced back into society, Anna makes progress as her new job gets underway. Then she is drugged at a work event, a coworker drowns, and her house is broken into. As the truth unfolds and danger rises, Anna must decide if she will fight to stay or be forced to go.

House of the Broken Promise is driven by elements of suspense, romance, and humor, taking the reader on an emotional journey of triumph, not just of good over evil, but of love over bitter heartbreak, and friendship over solitude.

The Finger Lakes area is home to many small farms and businesses related to the production of fibers for the textile arts. Farmers raise plants and animals as sources of fiber, while local artisans and craft enthusiasts utilize these fibers to create beautiful and utilitarian works of art.

Tours of some local fiber farms and craft centers will give participants a view of how yarns and textiles begin, as well as how they are used by some Finger Lakes artists.

Carol Gyory Fitzsimons '72 will demonstrate "Painting with Fiber," a technique she uses to produce landscapes and other nature-themed works.

There will also be time for participants to work on their own fiber-arts projects while enjoying the serene beauty of the Wells campus and Cayuga Lake, as well as the opportunity to sample local cuisine and beverages.


