There are **TWO** ways to get involved!

All Volunteers: Attend an annual volunteer training workshop

## #1 "HABs Harriers"

- Survey an assigned "zone" for HABS (June-Oct.)
- Be able to accurately ID HABS vs. pollen/duck weed/etc.
- Report the HABS via online Google Form in a timely fashion
- Collect HAB samples safely per CSI protocol

## #2 "Water Carriers"

- Be "on call" from June-Oct. to assist in relay/transport of HABS samples from around Cayuga Lake to the CSI lab
- Communicate/coordinate transport logistics among other volunteers
- Frequency of trips depends on frequency of HABS

All Volunteers: Ensure HABS samples remain cool/on ice and arrive at the CSI lab within 48 hours of collection

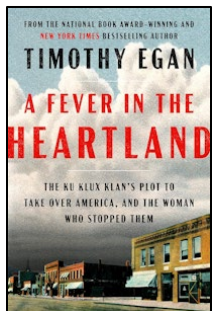

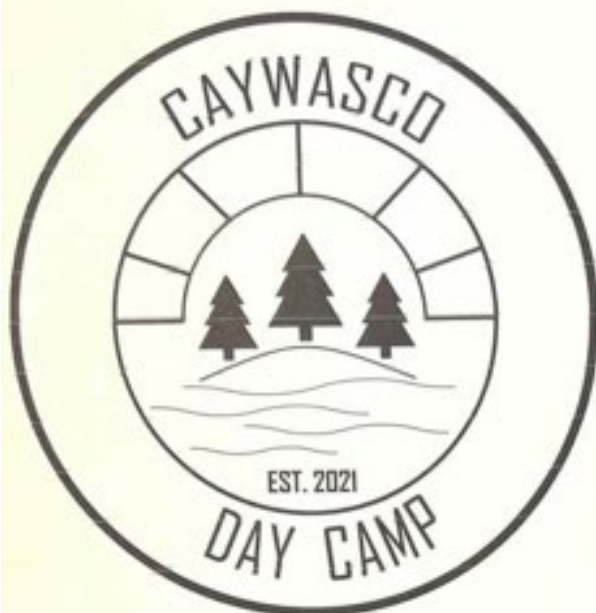
