There are TWO ways to get involved!

All Volunteers: Attend an annual volunteer training workshop

#1 "HABs Harriers"

- Survey an assigned "zone" for HABS (June-Oct.)
- Be able to accurately ID HABs vs. pollen/duck weed/etc.
- Report the HABs via online Google Form in a timely fashion
- Collect HAB samples safely per CSI protocol

#2 "Water Carriers"

- Be "on call" from June-Oct. to assist in relay/transport of HABs samples from around Cayuga Lake to the CSI lab
- Communicate/coordinate transport logistics among other volunteers
- Frequency of trips depends on frequency of HABs

All Volunteers: Ensure HABs samples remain cool/on ice and arrive at the CSI lab within 48 hours of collection





Prior to its formation in 1794, Scipio was a battleground for the American War of Independence. The "scorched earth" policy of the 1779 Sullivan-Clinton campaign forced the indigenous people --perceived as supporters of the British-to flee their homeland and take refuge in Canada. Later, hordes of Yankee settlers moved in, finding prosperous land sold by developers for a low price. Some brought enslaved persons, who later formed the basis of a free African American community that welcomed fugitives from Southern enslavement. The exhibit will present these three migrations side by side as formative influences on the birth of the town.


We will be having a reduced Mass schedule for the weekend of August 10/11. The Masses that weekend will be as follows:
