
# **Community Read**

Work on the East Porch has been suspended till more suitable weather arrives in the spring. It has been 5 months since the start of the project, with 840 hours of volunteer work recorded.

Join us for some popcorn and a movie TBA. The movie will have a "spiritual" "religious" kind of base.


#### Wells Professor of Religion Emeritus Dr. Arthur Bellinzoni - Sunday, February 23, 4 p.m.






