

The King Ferry Food Pantry's BackPack Program







Weekly Volunteers - high school students making a difference!

The King Ferry Food Pantry's BackPack Program is dedicated to tackling food insecurity among students at Southern Cayuga Schools. This initiative discreetly provides at-risk children with bags of nutritious, easy-to-prepare food every Friday afternoon, ensuring they have access to meals over the weekend. While free and reduced breakfast and lunch programs offer vital nutrition during the school week, some children lack reliable access to food during weekends and school breaks.

By offering non-perishable, easy-to-prepare food items, the BackPack Program bridges this gap, helping students maintain healthy eating habits and alleviating food-related stress. The program not only combats hunger but also supports the overall well-being and academic success of participating children, enabling them to return to school on Monday ready to learn.

Each week, the menu features a variety of food items to ensure a balanced diet, including proteins, grains, fruits, vegetables, beverages, and snacks. Current inventory includes breakfast items (such as cereal, oatmeal packets, granola bars, breakfast bars, and shelf-stable milk), entrées (like peanut butter, canned pasta with meat, tuna, chicken, and soups), and snacks (such as crackers, cookies, pudding cups, and fruit cups). Occasionally, fresh fruits and personal hygiene items are added to further support students' needs.

Our program partners at Southern Cayuga School include coordinators Anita Furness and Bill Hasenjager, along with high school students Celeste Herrera, Samantha Lopez, Trinity Rodriguez, and Kathy Smith. Each week, they work together to fill the bags, deliver them to student lockers, and monitor the food inventory.

We would like to extend our heartfelt gratitude to the many generous donors who support the BackPack Program. Their contributions are essential in ensuring that at-risk children have access to nutritious meals and snacks over the weekend, helping to create a stronger, healthier community.




