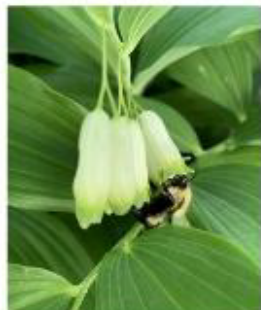

As soft spring politely excuses herself, making way for simmering summer, it can be difficult to find the time to take it all in! As the days grow longer, the extra light is such a welcome blessing. Rising earlier and staying up later to take advantage of the "extra hours" in the day becomes easier and more enjoyable. It's open window season, and I know I am not the only one enjoying the extra sunshine. Each morning before dawn the birds begin singing the joyful return of the light, their songs a sweet cadence much more enjoyable than the buzz of the alarm. They seem to say get up and join us! As the morning mist burns off turkeys join in, gobbling their morning greetings and gripes to the rest of the flock. They seem to say wake up and get moving, the days a wastin'!



The growing season is really taking off and it is important to remember that this is a time for planting the seeds of what you would like to harvest this summer. It can take a tremendous amount of work to plant a garden, as it requires persistence and determination to keep it thriving until harvest time. I have been spending some evenings dividing and transplanting cherished perennials ensuring that they all have the space they need to grow into their fullest potential. Other days I am planting new seeds and tending to baby plantings, each bringing their own flavor and personality to the garden.

Gardening is about doing the work up front, and trusting the process until harvest time. It can be difficult to have patience for the fruits while you tend to the roots and the shoots. Things like fluctuating weather can be an annoyance. On cold days frost can set you back or require extra work to overcome. On hot days watering can feel like another task one doesn't need right now. But like the plants, it's important to stay flexible. Plants don't complain when it's too cold or hot, they just hunker down and do their best to sustain. Some days are for growing, others are for simply maintaining. Growth can look or feel slow sometimes, especially when each day is compared to one another. It's important to remember that behind the scenes things are happening in their own time, and taking the time to honor each stage of growth and celebrate each milestone is what the journey is all about.

Evenings in the garden are for more leisurely pursuits. I enjoy watching the deer group together in the fields after the sun goes down each day. They come out of the woods to snack and visit, chase each other and let the littles run around until well past bedtime.

It can feel overwhelming with all the tasks and plans that summer can bring, but it is also important to remember that the good, hard work that one puts in will reap beautiful, delicious results. Use the extra energy of the season to inspire and invigorate yourself to grow, and share that energy when you can to help others tend to their garden.

June Updates from Howland Stone Store Museum and Opendore

The Southern Cayuga Historical Consortium is made up of the Howland Stone Store Museum, the Frontenac Museum, the Genoa Historical Society, and the Aurora - Ledyard Historical Society. This group of museums has been highlighted in the FingerLakes Tourism Alliance guide for the last two years and recently participated in the literature exchange event sponsored by the FLTA at Del Lago. Braving rainy and windy weather, representatives from many organizations and businesses across the region exchanged brochures, rack cards, and flyers so that information about the wonderful opportunities that the Finger Lakes offer could be available at other places of business, reminding locals as well as vacationers about all the interesting sights that can be enjoyed here in the Finger Lakes. This summer, don't forget to take full advantage of these four museums here in our own backyard.



On Sunday, May 17, the Howland Stone Store Museum held their Annual Meeting at Opendore. President Michael Groth facilitated the meeting, leading to the acceptance of last year's minutes as well as the financial report. He highlighted ongoing projects such as the Hazard Library addition, and the landscape initiative. Guy Garnsey gave a facilities report, Marilyn Post spoke on collections work and Larry Bell summarized new historical discoveries about the Howland Family.

Board elections followed with Marilyn Post and Larry Bell agreeing to continue on the board with Tryg Ager being elected to replace Bill Schmitt. Thanks go out to Bill for all his contributions while on the board and gratitude for his willingness to still be involved behind the scenes in the coming months.

Tom Guiler rounded out the evening with an interesting presentation on "Three Harriets: The Story of Extraordinary Women in the Oneida Community." He is the Director of Museum Affairs for the Oneida Community Mansion House and his presentation prompted a long question and answer period, also instilling an interest in a visit to the museum itself.
